

#### Methodology- Print Survey

- On October 30, 2023, a survey packet was mailed to 2,006 property owners.
- Approximately one week later, a post card was mailed to these addresses.
- On November 20, approximately two weeks after the postcard mailing, a second survey packet was mailed to non-respondents.
- Field phase ended Tuesday, January 2, 2024.
- Completed print surveys were returned through U.S. mail from 638 respondents.
- Response rate = 32.7% (subtracting 52 bad addresses from total of 2,006)

#### Methodology- Online Survey

- On November 9 and November 10, 2023, 5,700 fliers were delivered by CMU to the U.S. Post Office.
- In the next several days, fliers with QR codes and the URL to the survey were distributed to mailboxes in Union Township via the Every Door Delivery Method (EDDM) of the U.S. Post Office
- Only 89 respondents completed surveys by December 15, 2023.
- This cannot be considered a scientific sample given the low response rate.

#### Online sample

- Younger, lived in the Township for fewer years, more likely to live in high density apartments/condo complexes, lower income
- Many experiences and opinions are similar, although more likely to report "don't know."
- Noted differences regarding preference for social media and low ratings for water and sewer services, high priority for snowplowing of sidewalks and recycling for apartments, definite support for multi-family housing and use of farmland for solar energy development.
- Less likely to use Township parks, more likely to not know where they are located; more likely to use Jameson Park, more likely to support small neighborhood parks and a park on the south side of the Township.
