Subject: Adjustments to Accountant's Position

I have completed a review of the current compensation level of our Accountant, and potential adjustments that could be made to that position and department. I have reviewed not only our accountant's current function and compensation level, but have also reviewed the relevant material available to me on comparable positions in the area. As a result of that research, I would recommend the following:

- 1. Based on the operations being handled by our Accountant, I believe it is warranted that the title of this position be changed from Accountant to Finance Director. This change more appropriately reflects the current function of that individual, and office.
- 2. As a reflection of the increased work load and responsibility of the Finance Director, I recommend a salary increase to \$60,000 for the 2016 fiscal year.
- 3. I further recommend that a part time assistant be hired to work in that office, assuming whatever duties are assigned by the Finance Director. The hours of employment for this position will be determined by the Finance Director and the Township Manager, with Board approval.

Due to the nature of the work load being carried currently by our Accountant, I urge the Union Township Board to consider these changes soon.
