#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

As part of the annual gravel road maintenance program, the ICRC and the Township partner to rehabilitate several miles of gravel road annually. The ICRC and the Township spilt the cost of two (2) miles equally while the Township pays for all of the other two (2) miles. The aggregate cost share is 75% Township and 25% ICRC. The 2019, cost per mile for gravel resurfacing is \$18,000.

For 2019, the ICRC recommends that following two (2) miles of road be serviced:

- Wing Road Whiteville Meridian
- Valley Road Mission Isabella

For 2019, the remaining two (2) miles of roads to be serviced is yet to be determined by the Township Board of Trustees. A map has been provided which identifies all the primary and secondary roads in Union Township. The gravel roads that have been previously completed are identified by year.

#### **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

These contracts provide for the overlay of 1,000 ton of 23-A modified gravel per mile.

#### **JUSTIFICATION**

The approval of these contracts will continue to improve the conditions of roads throughout the Township.

#### **PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS**

The following Board of Trustees goals are addressed with these appointments (From Policy 1.0: Global End)

- Community well-being and common good
- Prosperity through economic diversity, cultural diversity, and social diversity
- Safety

#### **C**OSTS

The Township's cost share for these contracts is \$54,000 with the ICRC contributing \$18,000. At the time of budget adoption, it was estimated that the Township share would be \$48,000. As such, a budget amendment will be needed in the amount of \$6,000 which will be included in budget amendment #1. This action item is anticipated to be an agenda item at the June 12, 2019 Board meeting.

#### **PROJECT TIME TABLE**

The road improvements will occur during the 2019 construction season.
